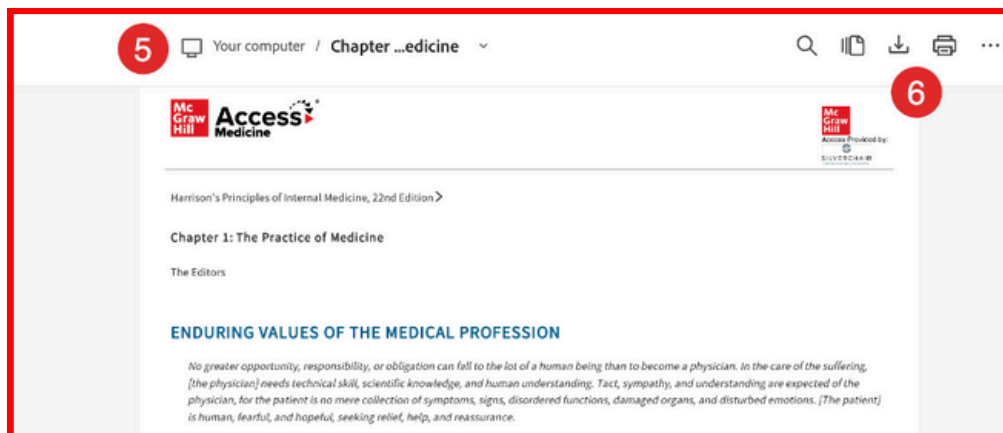
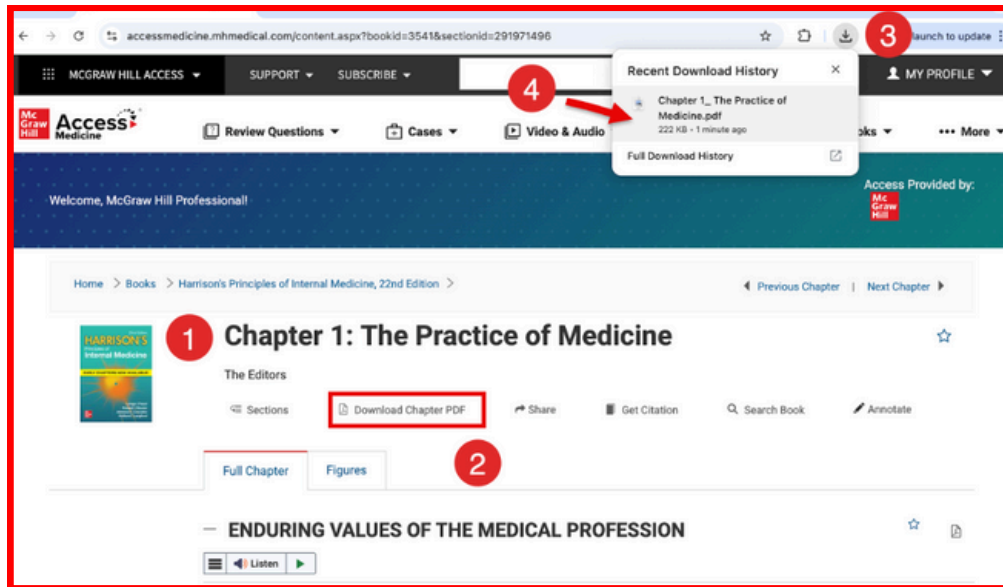

# How Do I Download a Book Chapter or Section?

You can download any book chapter or book section from McGraw Hill's Access sites. Chapters and Sections download as a PDF.

## To Download a Book Chapter:

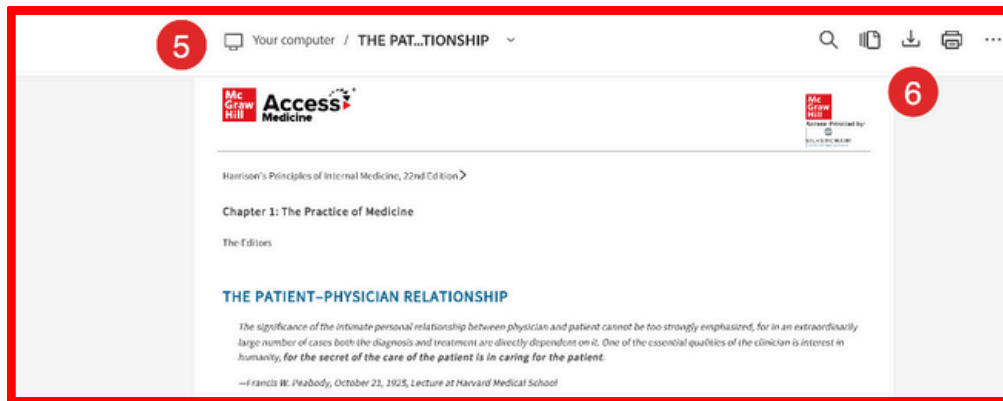
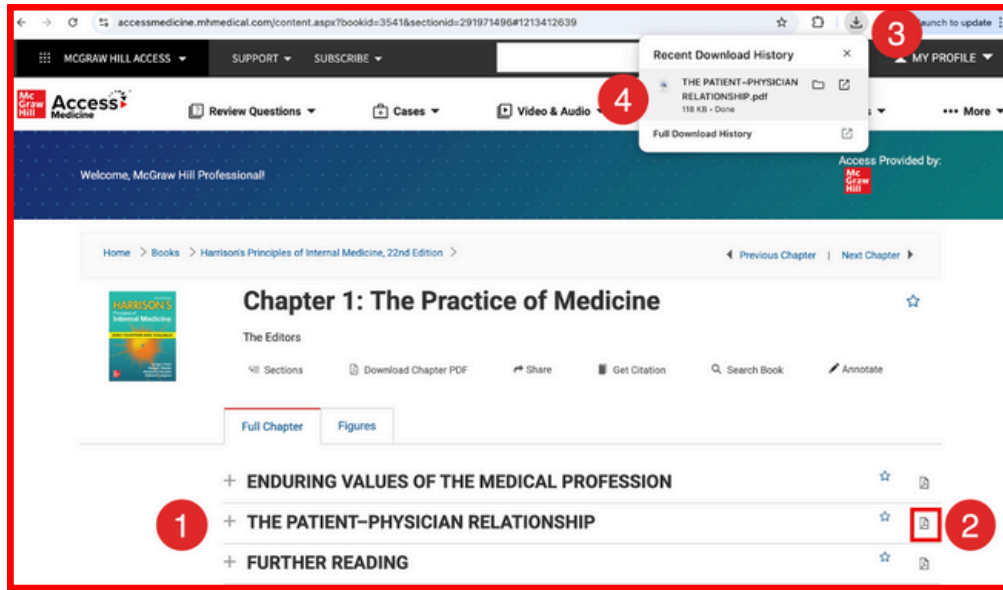


1. Open a book chapter
2. Click **Download Chapter PDF**
3. The chapter will appear in your browser's list of downloads.

**Note:** In this example, we are using the Chrome browser. The list of downloads will look slightly different and may appear on a different part of the screen if you are using a browser like Firefox, Safari, or Microsoft Edge.

4. Click on the **name of the downloaded chapter** in the list of downloads
5. The chapter will open as a **PDF** on your device
6. Click the **download icon** to choose where to save this chapter on your device for offline viewing. Click the **printer icon** to print the chapter.

## To Download a Chapter Section:



1. Open a book chapter and navigate to a **chapter section**
2. Click the Download Section **PDF icon** next to the section you want to download
3. The section will appear in your browser's list of downloads.

**Note:** In this example, we are using the Chrome browser. The list of downloads will look slightly different and may appear on a different part of the screen if you are using a browser like Firefox, Safari, or Microsoft Edge.

4. Click on the **name of the downloaded section** in the list of downloads
5. The section will open as a **PDF** on your device
6. Click the **download icon** to choose where to save this section on your device for offline viewing. Click the **printer icon** to print the section.

Users can download as many book chapters or sections as they want; however, there is no button to download multiple book chapter PDFs or section PDFs at one time. There is no button for downloading an entire book.

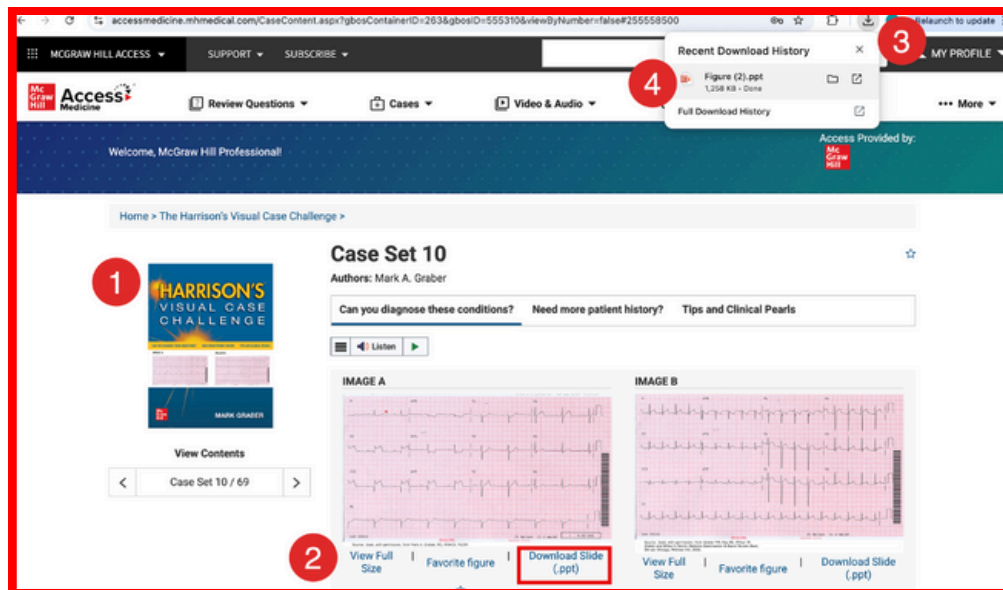

You can download any image, figure or table from McGraw Hill's Access sites. Images and Figures download as PowerPoint Slides, while tables download as PDFs.

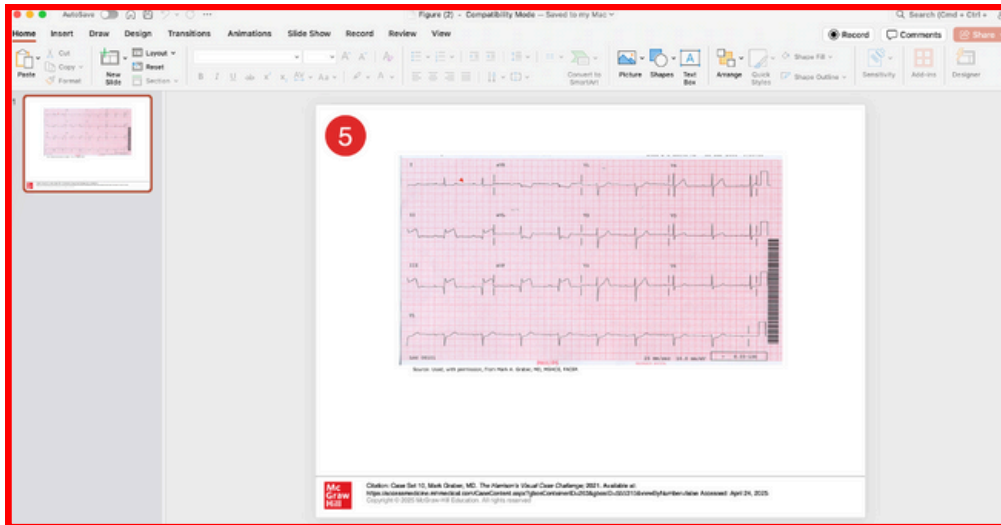
### To Download an Image:



1. Find an image (ex: Image A in Case Set 10)
2. Click **Download Slide (.ppt)**
3. The image will appear in your browser's list of downloads.

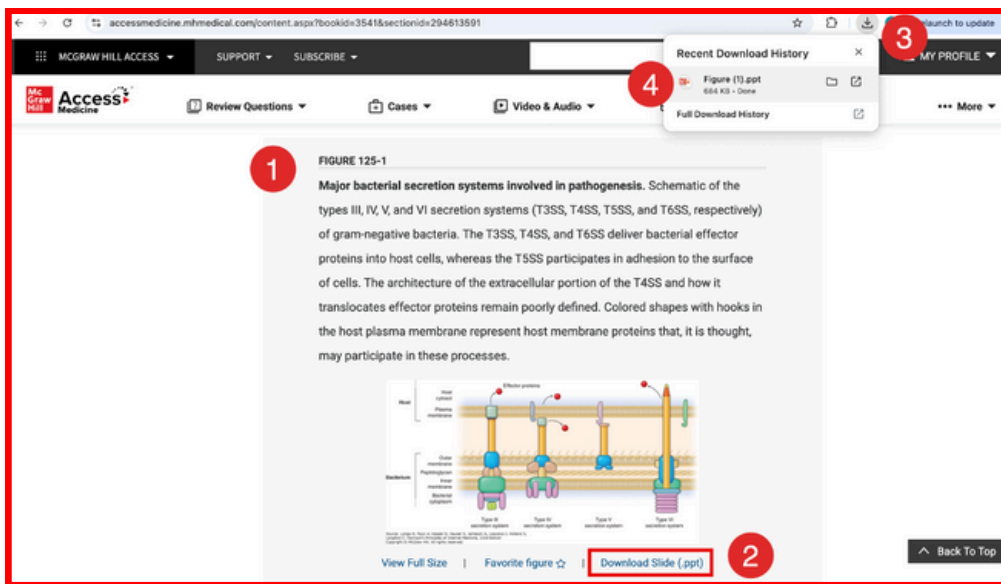

5. The image will open as a **PPT slide** on your device.

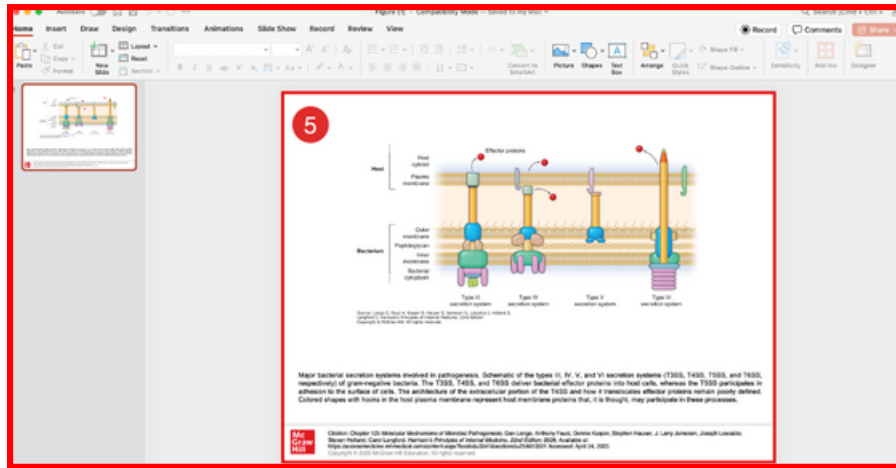
### To Download a Figure:



1. Find a figure (ex: Figure 125-1)
2. Click **Download Slide (.ppt)**
3. The figure will appear in your browser's list of downloads.

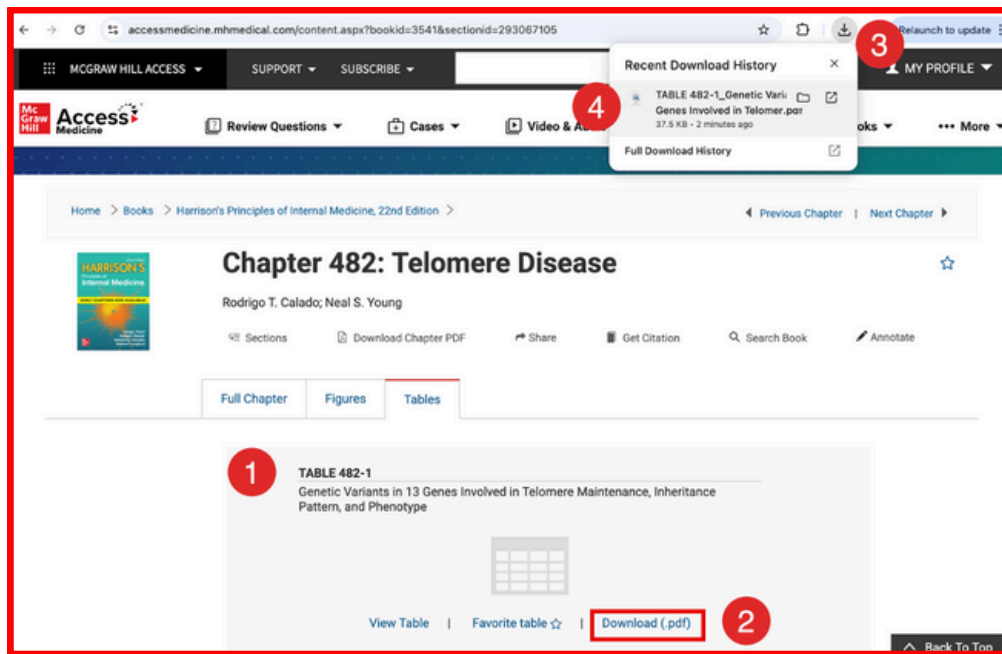

### To Download a Table:



1. Find a table (ex: Table 482-1).
2. Click **Download (.pdf)**
3. The table will appear in your browser's list of downloads.
