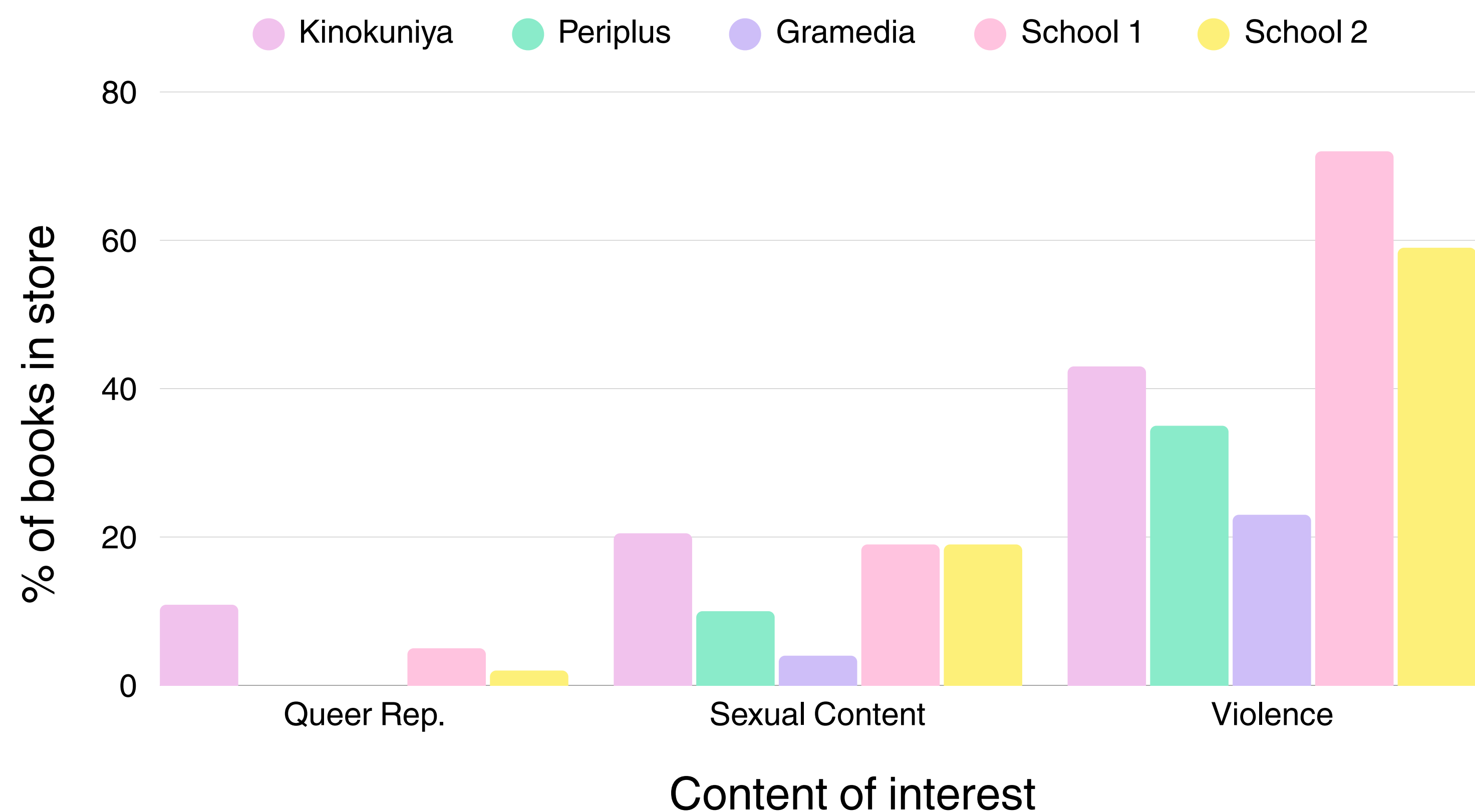


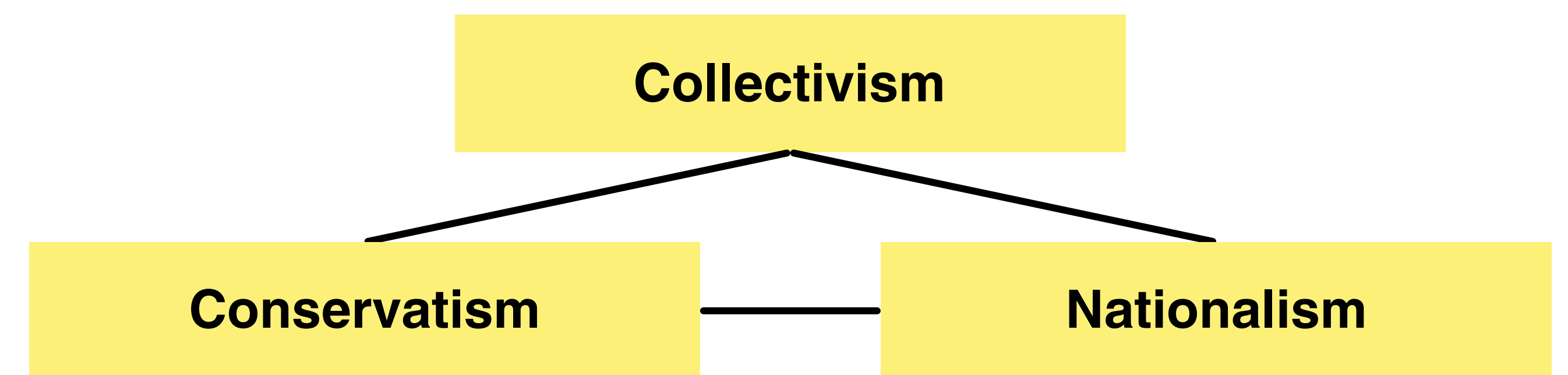

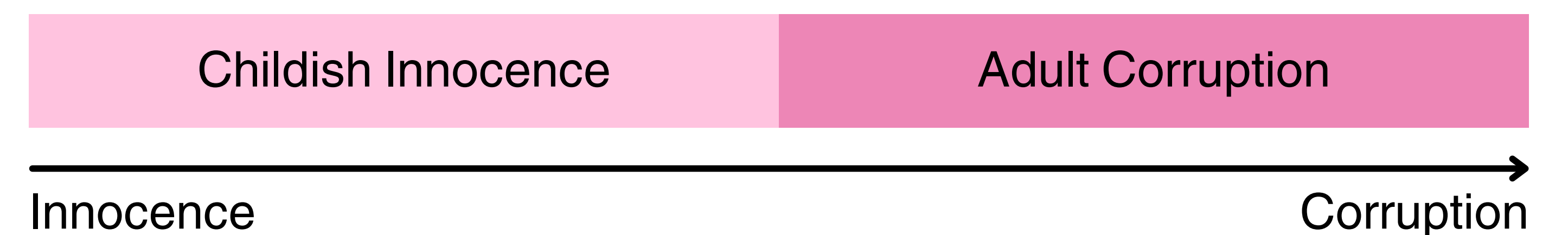
Availability of Books in Indonesia



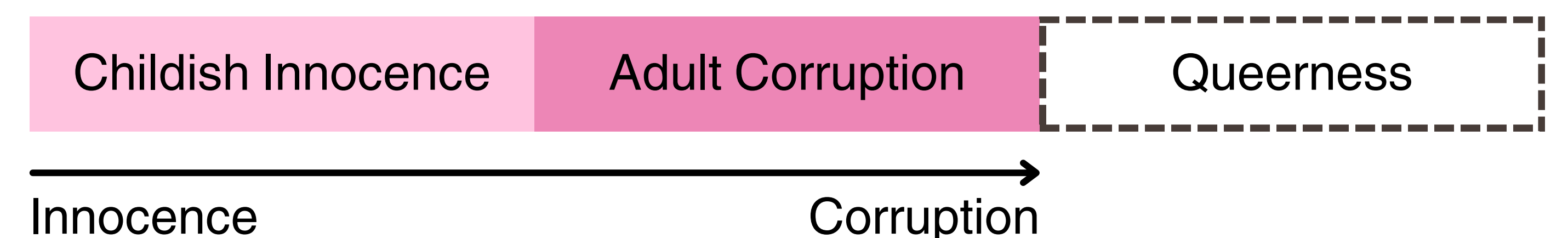
Pillars of Censorship in Indonesia
