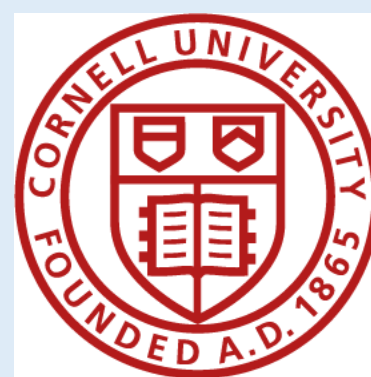

- Languages are key to maintaining and transmitting cultural knowledge and beliefs
- Many local/regional languages in Indonesia are becoming endangered
- How is Balinese faring given this context?

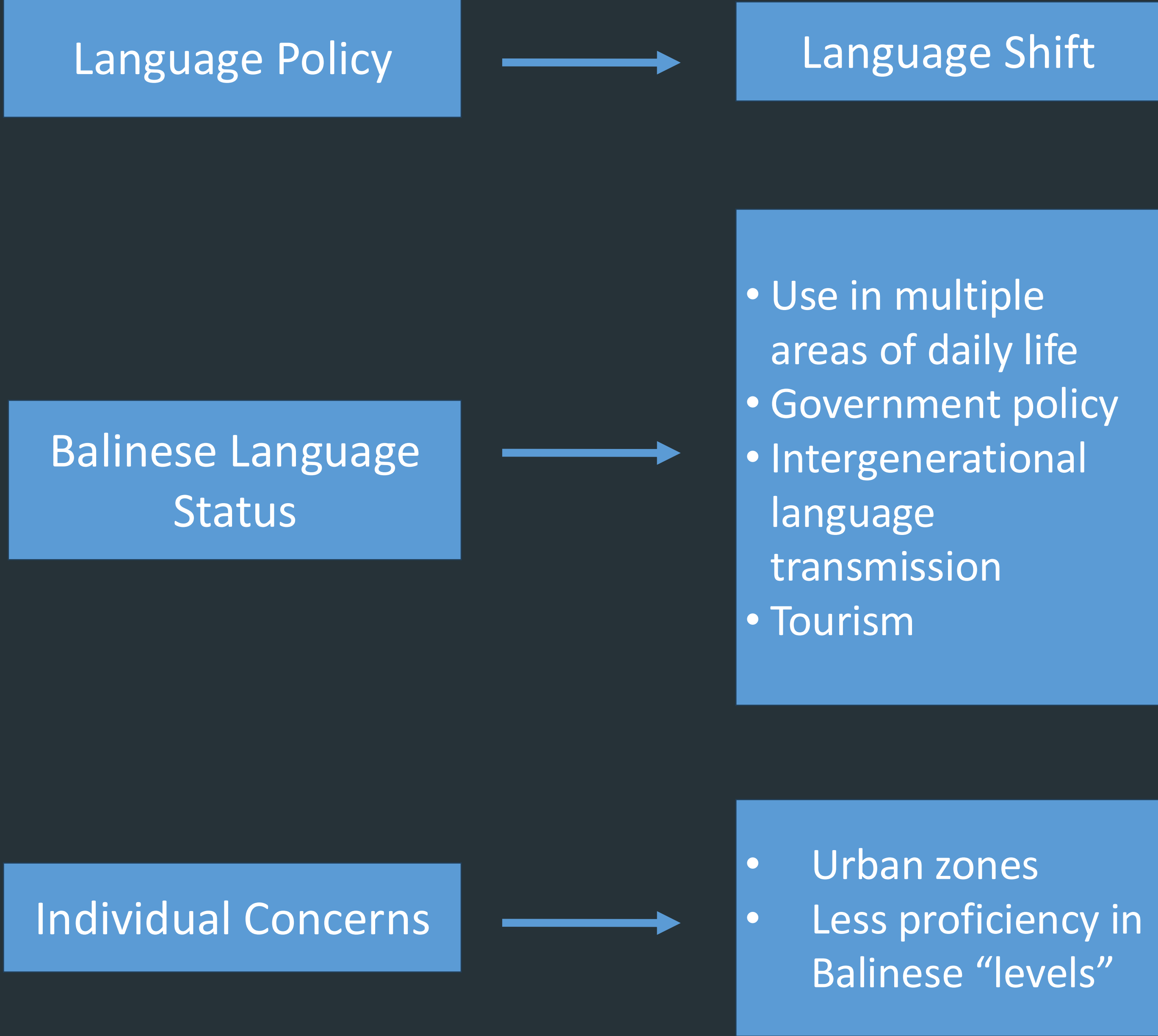


Methods:

- Literature review on Balinese language status
- 5 databases/sources, 20 scholarly sources
- Used Boolean operators (AND, OR NOT) to elicit appropriate search results.
