

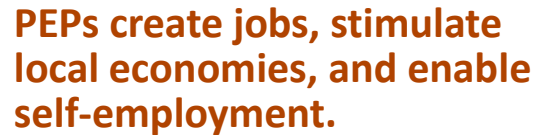

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Methodology

A mixed-method approach

- Literature review of South African and international research on PEPs and unemployment
- Semi-structured, qualitative interviews with researchers, PEPs participants, community leaders, and parliamentarians
- Stories from PEPs beneficiaries
- Site visits to implementing partners of PES



PEPs provide jobs when employment is scarce

In Q1 2026, the end of Phase 5 of a major PEP was the largest contributor to the rise in unemployment.³

- ## PEP spending circulates through local economies

PEP promote self-employment.

PEPs improve mental well-being.

Unemployment poses a significant public health concern

"Long-term unemployment is associated with greater incidence of suicide."⁸

Employment builds purpose and fulfillment

South African youth who transitioned into employment reported stronger career identity, future planning, well-being, and life satisfaction.⁹

PEPs strengthen communities.

Reading benchmarks doubled in schools supported by PEP-supported literacy coaches¹⁰

Lower conflict levels in Indian districts where participation in PEPs responded to income shocks¹¹



Before PEP funding:
Individually building a mobile reading library in Vrygrond.

After PEP funding:

- hired local young adults
- purchased more books and materials
- created after-school programmes
- opened a permanent library
- expanded into other villages

Public Employment Programs (PEPs) are:

- ## PEP participants build technical and transferable skills.

4 x Young people with work experience are **more likely to secure employment**⁶

93% Graduates of the Sozo Foundation, a PEP implementing partner, **progressed to employment, education, training, or entrepreneurship**⁷

PEPs advance Constitutional promises.

- **Sections 1(a) and 7(2):** Unemployment blocks the promise of "human dignity" and of freeing "the potential of each person." PEPs are a way for the state to "respect, protect, promote and fulfil" these rights.
- **Sections 26-27:** The state must take "reasonable measures" toward the "progressive realization" of socioeconomic rights.

Model for a Changing Global Labor Market

Unemployment is projected to increase worldwide, fueled by climate change and the AI boom. South Africa's PEPs can serve as a model for how other countries address unemployment.
